

February 21, 1986 LB 448, 504

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I believe I have already explained the bill. Ladies and gentlemen, I ask its advancement. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance LB 448. Is there discussion? If not, all those in favor of advancing the bill vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Next is LB 504.

CLERK: 504, Mr. President, was a bill introduced by Senator Remmers. (Read title.) It was read in January of last year, referred to the Judiciary Committee, advanced to General File, Mr. President. I do have committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Chairman Hoagland of the committee.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: LB 504 is a bill brought to us by Senator Remmers, which does two things. It provides for mandatory sentences in criminal cases, in drug cases, in certain drug cases, and it provides for mandatory counseling in certain drug cases as a condition of probation. The committee amendment strikes the first part of the bill, the part requiring mandatory sentences, so the bill simply requires mandatory drug counseling which the committee thinks is an excellent idea. I ask for the adoption of the committee amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on the amendments? If not, the motion is to adopt the amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the committee amendments.
