PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on the bill? If not, the motion is to advance the bill from General File. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. The motion is to advance the bill. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: LB 433 is advanced. The Clerk has matters for the record.

CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee on Appropriations offers notice of hearing for February 28. Senator Landis has amendments to 844 to be printed. Your Committee on Government reports 929 to General File; 930 to General File; 1089 to General File with amendments. Those are all signed by Senator Landis. (See pages 916-17 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Very well, we will proceed to LB 573.

CLERK: Mr. President, 573 was a bill that was introduced by Senator Lynch and DeCamp. (Read title.) Read in January of last year, referred to Banking Committee, advanced to General File. There are Banking Committee amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lynch, can you handle the Banking Committee amendments?

SENATOR LYNCH: Yes, sir. Mr. President and members, I would like to briefly explain, first of all a quick explanation of the bill. Underinsured (interruption).

PRESIDENT: Senator Lynch, just a moment, please. Members, (gavel) may we have a little lowering of your conversational tone, please. Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. President and members, underinsured coverage is insurance a motorist buys to protect him or herself in case he or she becomes involved in a motor vehicle accident with a person who only carries minimum coverage, which is less than the amount the motorist would be entitled to or like to be insured for. And it is about as simple as that. The bill also provides that insurance
