

February 21, 1986 LB 84, 419

PRESIDENT: Chairman Vickers of the Education Committee for the amendments.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, members, the amendment to LB 84 simply clarifies in one section of the bill that the city treasurer does not have to sign the school district warrants which was the intent of the bill throughout to remove the city treasurer from the Lincoln school district's procedures. So I would ask for the adoption of that committee amendment.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on the committee amendments? If not, the motion is to adopt the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record your vote on the adoption of Education Committee amendments to LB 84. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: The amendments are adopted. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Very briefly. LB 84 deals with an archaic piece of legislation that has a city treasurer handling as a formality the school district of Lincoln's account budget in certain circumstances. There is no reason why we would have to do that and so we just take out the city treasurer as an officer of the Lincoln School District.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on the bill? If not, the motion is to advance LB 84 from General File. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record your vote on the advancement of LB 84. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 84 is advanced. LB 419.

CLERK: Mr. President, 419 was a bill that was introduced by the Education Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) It was read on January of last year, referred to the Education Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments attached.
