be on the regional boards, they could be anybody that a particular region wanted to have on there. So it just gives some flexibility and I would appreciate support for the committee amendment.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on the committee amendments? If not, the motion is to adopt the amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: The amendments are adopted. Senator Wesely, anything further?

SENATOR WESELY: No. Just to tell you again, what we are doing is getting rid of one committee that hasn't really been doing any good and merging the Drug Abuse and the Alcohol Committees into one. Six of the 12 members would come from the regions, six would come from the Governor, and, hopefully, that would make it a more workable situation and should save maybe a little money.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on the bill? If not, the motion is to advance the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance 674, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The bill is advanced. We move to LB 481.

CLERK: 481 by Senator Haberman. (Read title.) Read in January of last year, referred to Judiciary, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Chairman Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Mr. President and colleagues, Senator Haberman's bill requires that local law enforcement officers be notified when an individual who has been convicted of first degree sexual assault or first degree murder is given
