bill. And with that brief summary, I would simply urge your advancement of the bill. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on LB 90? If not, the motion is to advance the bill from General File. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. We move to LB 543.

CLERK: 543, Mr. President, is a bill by Senator Pirsch. (Read title.) Read on January 22 of last year, referred to the Judiciary Committee, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Chairman Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: This bill was brought to us by Senator Pirsch and it was advanced from the Judiciary Committee with no dissenting votes. This is a bill which deals generally with the disposition of seized property by law enforcement officers. Some of the property rooms by law enforcement offices are getting overcrowded. It was brought to us particularly by the Lincoln Police Department and, of course, through Senator Pirsch's office. The committee adopted amendments that basically refined the bill, improved it. Those amendments are set out in the committee explanation. I would ask the adoption of the amendments.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on the committee amendments? If not, the motion is to adopt the amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: The committee amendments are adopted and the Chair recognizes Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you. I move the advancement of LB 543. It will eliminate some of the red tape and assist our law enforcement.
