

February 21, 1986 LB 816, 817

CLERK: Mr. President, 816 was a bill introduced by the Revenue Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) Introduced this year, referred to Revenue, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, every year the Department of Revenue brings to the Revenue Committee some cleanup bills and this is essentially a cleanup bill on the taxation of motor vehicles. The committee amendment, I think, provides a little appeal process on the way motor vehicles are taxed and it was agreed to by the Revenue Department. I move the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Further discussion? The motion is the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: The committee amendments. Anything further, Chairman Johnson?

CLERK: No, I don't think so.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance the bill from General File. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Next is LB 817.

CLERK: 817 was offered by the Revenue Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) It was introduced this year, Mr. President. It was referred to Revenue, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Chairman Johnson of the committee.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker and members of the
