SPEAKER NICHOL: You are dividing it into two parts.

SENATOR VICKERS: Yes.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right. That will be done. Did you wish to speak to the first section?

SENATOR VICKERS: Yes, I would.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right.

SENATOR VICKERS: Now which one is the first section now?

SPEAKER NICHOL: I assume that would be Section 2, subsection (c), has to do with parents of a minor child that have never been married, is that the one you wish to speak on?

SENATOR VICKERS: Right. I would. Now do we want to take that up first, or do we want to take up the whole amendment first, or the rest of the amendment? Which one is number one? Just so I know which one I'm speaking to.

SPEAKER NICHOL: We'll take up this one right now, Section 2, subsection (c), "parents of the minor child have never been married."

SENATOR VICKERS: Okay.

SPEAKER NICHOL: We'll take that one up now.

SENATOR VICKERS: Okay, thank you, Mr. President. I asked to divide this out because I think that this is a different policy question than the whole policy. Now, quite frankly, I have a lot of difficulty with the whole policy. I do not believe that it is the correct procedure to put into place a mechanism whereby grandparents can intervene in an area that
