I urge you to support Senator Haberman's amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CHRONISTER: Senator Pappas.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Question.

SENATOR CHRONISTER: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? They are there. The question is, shall we cease debate? All in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Have you voted? We are voting on whether to cease debate or not. Please vote. The vote is whether to cease debate or not, and time is running short. Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 4 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR CHRONISTER: Debate is ceased. Senator Haberman to close, please.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the body, if you will check the records, Mr. Lamberty testified in favor of the bill. He said it should be from 15 to 20 percent. I've lowered it to 15. We put a 20,000 limit on it to keep out the small trucks that are only used two or three times a year. The truck driver will have the permit on his person to show if he is using the proper road. And I think this is a good thing to do. We've discussed it. I'm sure you all understand it, so I'll just ask that you advance the bill. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CHRONISTER: We are voting on whether to adopt the Haberman amendment. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 5 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR CHRONISTER: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have on the bill is one by Senator Warner. He would move to indefinitely postpone. That would lay it over unless the introducer agrees to take it up at this time.
