for overweight on axles. They can't do it. They can't cite them. They can't arrest them. The cattle can be shifted. You can't shift beets. You can't get up there with a pitchfork and if you've got one axle overloaded, and the other one isn't, you can't stand up there and...you ought to see the size of the beets. Some of them are half the size of pumpkins. Some of them are the size of oranges. When they are frozen hard you can't do it. So the axle thing doesn't really come into it, as Senator Warner said, because cattle trucks can already do it. They can't be cited. So I'm saying to you if the cattle trucks can do it, and nobody is raising any fuss or doing anything about that, then we should allow everybody else basically the same privilege. So I ask you to advance the bill. Thank you, Mr. President.
