

information about what is going on in the subdistricts.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, can't you by this map get also the information showing the population of each of those subdistricts?

SENATOR WESELY: No, you can't get that now, and the NRC frankly, Rex, I don't want to take all your time, but I know the NRC has tried to find this information when we did some research in recent years on bills. They tried to come back with the report of information. They couldn't get it so this would be valuable to them as well.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, Don, I am saying that the value would...also the valuation of the tax property in each subdistrict, that is really available information. You can get that. You know they have to set their mill levy.

SENATOR WESELY: Not by subdistrict, by the whole district, yes, but not by subdistrict, that is the difference.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I see. Okay, thank you, Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Sure.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Schmit, then Senator Nelson.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Well, Mr. President and members of the body, I understand some of Senator Wesely's concern in this area but I would just like to suggest that you know if we begin this process we could do it also in the school district areas, especially in relation to the valuation. It might be of a lot of interest to some people to know that in many of those Class III school districts which have a rural population base that they have about 10 percent of the population and about 50 percent or more of the valuation, and yet they have perhaps only one member on the school board. I think, and I know that Senator Wesely is concerned about the lack of adequate representation, in his opinion that you are not represented because of not having an exactly one man, one vote rule, but the courts have ruled that nomination by subdistrict and election otherwise takes care of that problem. I would just like to suggest that maybe, Senator Wesely, the amendment is a little premature. I think that we have LB 902 in the committee which will probably come to the floor when Senator Lynch wants it to
