SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Withem, would you like to close please?

SENATOR WITHEM: Yes, Senators, just very briefly.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Withem, excuse me, Senator Nelson's light just came on this moment. May she speak. Senator Nelson.

SENATOR NELSON: Members of the body, I have been very carefully listening to this legislation that does affect one person's constituency, that it was voted out of committee in a very clean bill without probably any particular problems, and how we have this delay tactic on General File. A senator's priority bill maybe, and maybe not, where one area is affected, the other area is not, and here we are, we are stalling on General File. I just want all of the body to remember what has happened in the last week or so. I am not condemning this bill. I am not for it or against it. I see one sponsor has a different idea than the others but let's just pay attention how much time we are wasting on this bill and let the body move forward.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Now, Senator Withem, would you like to close please?

SENATOR WITHEM: Yes, Mr. President, members of the body, Senator Nelson, I feel a need to respond to that comment I guess. This is not an issue...Senator Abboud has painted this as an issue that affects Ralston, Nebraska. Yes, it affects Ralston, Nebraska, but it is not Ralston, Nebraska. Senator Nelson, the reason we have a lot of confusion here with this bill at this point was because on General File it happened to be the company from Grand Island came in and said because of the way this was written it was going to cause their company to go out of business. That is pretty radical sort of talk. So we tried to accommodate them. We made some changes. Then that caused some problems over here and some problems over here. It is not a simple little issue, and all I am asking you to adopt right now is the one basic core part of the committee amendments that came out of committee, the eight to nothing vote to bring the bill out of committee, the one part of the committee amendments that
