

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, Mr. President, members of the body, I support the amendment. Senator Wesely raised the objection as to changing numbers and changing things around where things are supposed to be pretty standard, and I would like to call to his attention that we did change some boards already this morning, the number of members on boards, and the makeup of boards so I don't think this is a valid argument. This doesn't destroy the bill, doesn't harm the bill. It just adds more credence to the bill, and I think it is a good amendment, and I would like to ask the body to support it.

SENATOR WESELY: Senator Hartnett, did they clarify who is on there? Okay, I am sorry. I guess I don't have any big problem with the amendment and it is no big deal. If you want to put it on there, you can. I am not going to support the bill anyway so go ahead and put on your amendment in whatever form you want I guess.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, where is this amendment printed?

SPEAKER NICHOL: The only one I have is a sheet that was handed out. Is it printed anywhere else, Senator Chronister?

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. Speaker, members, I don't quite understand the reason behind the amendment. I don't think I will support it. I think I have been supportive of the bill to date but I will have to take a look at it on Select File and make a decision whether I will support it there or not. Thank you.
