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workers at the master's level and register them at the bachelor's level. Again, when you do that, it doesn't preclude others from performing similar functions but it makes it clear who is doing what, and if you are certified, you know that they are highly qualified to perform that function. So I would ask support for the committee amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any further discussion on the committee amendments? If not, the question is the adoption of the committee amendments. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. If you care to vote, please do so. We need a little help here, ladies and gentlemen. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of committee amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The committee amendments are adopted. Do you have anything else on it?

CLERK: Nothing further, Mr. Clerk.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Pat Morehead.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Mr. President, members of the body, this was a bill that I certainly agreed wholeheartedly to carry because in my particular district I have great numbers of social workers, both independent and with the two facilities, the Martin Luther home and Beatrice Developmental Center, and I have worked with social workers on many different levels. This group has been very cooperative in working out all the opposing sides and the nomenclature of the bill calls it licensure. They have agreed to certification and it has wholeheartedly been accepted by everyone involved and I would ask for its advancement.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Please vote if you care to. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is advanced. We will take up the A bill.
