

out in a lesser degree than what they hoped for in most cases, in some cases not, and so I think it worked beautifully. It actually worked out the process well and I think what you are seeing is the fruit of that effort. It is legislation that people feel comfortable with but it did de-emphasize some of the things that they wanted and I think it is good public policy.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: (No response.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vard Johnson, did you wish to speak.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Yes, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I was just going to make a comment in response to Senator Miller's remarks. I think that Senator Wesely covered it also in that the 407 credentialing and licensure and registration process resulted in my bill, in my bill, which was a registration bill being reduced to a statutory definition.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Goll, did you wish to close.

SENATOR GOLL: Mr. Speaker, I will waive closing, if we can just go ahead and vote. Thank you.

CLERK: 355A by Senator Goll. (Read title.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Goll.

SENATOR GOLL: Mr. Speaker, I would move the bill be passed.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the advancement of the A bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Please vote if you care to on the advancement of the A bill. We
