

qualify, to be going to postsecondary institutions. Generally it could be any institution, any public postsecondary institution in the state, but to fully fund what credits have been given at the various institutions would require \$146,000. On page 6 in the committee amendment on the Status of Women there is a \$10,000 figure which is next to the bottom of the page. That's Cash Funds. They had received a grant. It actually involves \$20,000. Half of it was to be expended during the current fiscal year and that increase in their cash fund authorization reflects that grant and that's a committee amendment. The next one is an increase in actual appropriation. It also deals with salaries. A portion of it is due to the change in...well, a portion of it is a bonus for, referred to as a bonus, for an administrative assistant and also a portion, \$500.00, is due to a payroll change from biweekly to monthly in the event that that occurs. This one necessitated a change in the appropriation. It is an extremely small agency, two people, and if there is any change whatsoever in salary, obviously it has to be reflected in the dollar amount. On page 7 there are two things in the committee amendment. There is an item that says 55,000, second line down. The Governor had recommended 20. The committee is recommending the full 55,000 which merely reflects the actual collection increase in tuition remissions, well it's an expenditure rather, not collection. The actual increase in tuition remissions that Kearney qualified for because they did a 5 percent surcharge following the special session to help offset some of the General Fund cuts and that tuition remission should be increased and we reflected the full amount. In number three we are substantially lower. The Governor is at \$83,625. The committee's recommendation is \$6,195 which, if you look back, this request was actually to in part to reduce their cash fund balance to offset tuition, or LB 1 cuts, and the committee recommends that that not be done and that those additional cash funds that they do have on hand be not expended during this fiscal year with the exception of the one-time expenditure for additional library materials and that's the \$6,000. On page 8 there is a nine thousand dollar, \$9,815, third line down deals with the State Fair Board. Last year we eliminated all funding for the State Board of Agriculture which is the State Fair. In that process that funding at that time had, a portion went for premiums, but the bulk of the money was partial salaries for four individuals and this would have represented, as we did with all other agencies that were terminated, the
