

accumulated vacation or sick leave that those employees would have been entitled to. The State Patrol is also in the committee amendment, 85,000. The Governor is at 115,000. The reason that we're at 85,000, currently the patrol does this work contractually or will be doing it contractually with the patrol, but they need the authorization of the Cash Fund. The money is currently appropriated to the Attorney General's Office, but it should be in the patrol. The difference between the Governor's and the committee recommendation, the 20,000, I believe anticipated the Liquor Control investigators being transferred to the patrol and since that decision is not made nor contained in this budget, we only did that portion pertaining to Odometer Fraud Cash Fund. It is not General Fund. Then you can see two approved at the bottom of the sheet and both of those again are no increase in funding, but it makes adjustments in the salary limitations for that agency. Then finally on page 9 there is again, with the Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice, there is an approval which is one of the salary adjustments, no increased cost. And the last one is, in fact, an increase, \$2,217 which is a reinstatement of that amount that was cut in LB 1, special session, but it dealt with the Village of Santee which does receive some funds and without the full amount of the appropriation why they would not be in a position to maintain their law enforcement personnel that they currently have. Now with that explanation, Mr. President, I or other members of the committee would be pleased to answer any question and if there is any particular one that anyone would like to have pulled out separately to discuss and vote on, why they merely need to indicate that to the Clerk.

PRESIDENT: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, I wish to divide the question. I wish to divide out of the question...the Clerk will read it. It's Legislative Council Agency. Go ahead.

CLERK: Essentially, Senator, I think you're asking to have divided out Section 5 of the committee amendment which deals with the Legislative Council.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Yes.
