SENATOR MARSH: I would request a call of the house. I think many members are off the floor and when we do not have a sufficient number of persons on the floor it makes it very difficult to do business.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator Marsh. A call of the house has been requested. All those in favor of the house coming under call vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 7 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The house is under call. All members in the Chamber, please look up to the front board and see that your green light is on indicating your presence. Members outside the Chamber, please return to the Unicameral Chamber. The house is under call. Unauthorized personnel should remove themselves from the floor while the house is under call. Five members are excused at the present time. Senator Barrett, Senator Chambers, Senators Chronister and Conway, Senator DeCamp, Senator Lowell Johnson, Senator Landis, Senator Lynch, Senator Jerry Miller, Senator Ron Withem, Senator Schmit and Senator Rupp, would you please record your presence. Thank you. And Senator Remmers. We're voting on the ceasing of debate, so call ins may be made. Senator Pirsch.

CLERK: Senator Pirsch voting yes. Senator Lundy voting yes. Senator Barrett voting yes. Senator Hefner voting yes. Senator Baack voting yes. Senator Hartnett, you had voted yes, Senator. Senator Goodrich voting yes. Senator Conway voting yes. Senator Withem voting yes. Senator Remmers voting yes. Senator Landis voting yes.

PRESIDENT: Call ins may be made still on the voting to cease debate. Are there other call in votes? Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Scofield, you had voted yes, Senator. 27 ayes, 4 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The debate is closed. Senator Warner may close the debate. May we have quiet in the Chamber, please. (Gavel.) The house is still under call.
