(Read summary of resolution. See pages 1055-56 of the Journal.) That will be laid over. That is all that I have, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: (Gavel.) Now if I could have your attention just a moment. We have two motions up that should not take anywhere near an hour's time. If we'll pay close attention, I think we can make up our minds on this relatively soon. I am covetous of time, as you well know, for the purpose that I'd like to have you handle your bills as promptly and as many as possible this session. So if we could have your attention on these two resolutions we'll move on. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: In order to save time, we'd like to pass over this bill and go to the second motion. We'll only make one motion.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Do you want to pass over 846 permanently?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes.

SPEAKER NICHOL: And just forget about.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right, so ordered. We'll move on to LB 1029. Actually there is a typing error on your agenda. I think you'll notice that should be 1029 instead of 1026. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Mr. Speaker, members, this is an issue that has been before this body now for the third year. The issue of Commonwealth has been a major issue facing our state for three years, and we have yet to resolve this catastrophe. Now I know many of you are tired of the issue and probably fatigued with the overwhelming burden that it has presented to us. But I ask you to bear with us again for at least one more effort to deal with the tragedy that has struck those 7,000 depositors who put their faith in the State of Nebraska and placed their money in Commonwealth. Now you can tell the difference in the issue just by, first off, there's a lot of senators not on the floor; and second off, there is no media coverage. The TV stations and what have you are not here. Last year and the year before, whenever the word Commonwealth came up, we had
