SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Abboud, did you wish to close on your amendment? The question is the adoption of the Abboud amendment to the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the amendment to the committee amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, the Abboud amendment is adopted. Now we are back to the committee amendment. Senator Peterson.

SENATOR PETERSON: I'd just...I have no further on the amendments. I will speak to the bill, but just move the committee amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, the question is the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are adopting the committee amendments. We are voting on the adoption of the committee amendments. We need a little help, ladies and gentlemen. Record, Mr. Clerk. Thank you.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The committee amendments are adopted. Back to the bill. Senator Peterson.

SENATOR PETERSON: Mr. Speaker and members, I might go on what Senator Wesely said. One thing that 318 does not do is it does not effect manicurists or nail artists. It does not change the administrative structure of the Department of Health. It does not merge the Barber Board under the Department of Health, and it does not...it will not allow the cosmetologists to shave, and it provides for the barbers...does not provide for the barbers to be inspected by the Department of Health.
