

and is going to be taking revenue away from the state. This gives the opportunity to local political subdivisions outside of Omaha and Lincoln the same opportunity, the same opportunity that was given Lincoln and Omaha, and some of the same people that got up and spoke against giving these other people the same opportunity are the ones that supported the Lincoln and Omaha concepts. Well, I guess some people think, well, now that we have got ours, you know, forget everybody else but I think we should look at the fairness doctrine and I ask you to adopt this amendment.

PRESIDENT: The motion is the adoption of the Lundy amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Voting on the adoption of the Lundy amendment to LB 890. Please record your vote. Have you all voted. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 7 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of that amendment.

PRESIDENT: The Lundy amendment is adopted. What is next, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Morehead would move to amend. (Morehead amendment appears on pages 1072-73 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Before I do that, Senator Morehead, let me announce that Senator Marsh has guests in the north balcony, a very fine group of 50 kindergarten children from Zeman School here in Lincoln along with their teachers. Thank you very much for coming. If you would all stand, we would like to welcome you to the Legislature. Senator Morehead.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Mr. President and members of the body, on your desk you should have a proposed amendment to LB 890 with my signature on it. This amendment I confess to you is brought to you directly from a problem that is existing...

PRESIDENT: (Gavel.)

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Thank you, Mr. President. ...that exists currently in the City of Beatrice and very conceivably could affect many of you at another time. Our statutes say that the issue of a sales tax can only be placed upon the ballot once every two years. Beatrice has had one vote on a sales
