the registry. It is not any new expenditure. It's just a redirection of current expenditures.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on the motion to advance LB 925A? If not, the motion is to advance. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance LB 925A.

PRESIDENT: LB 925A is advanced. LB 829.

CLERK: Mr. President, 829 was a bill introduced by Senator Smith. (Title read.) It was first read on January 9 of this year, referred to Health and Human Services, advanced to General File.

PRESIDENT: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. There is an amendment, I have an amendment on the bill.

CLERK: Do you want to do that now, Senator?

SENATOR SMITH: Yes.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Smith would move to amend and the amendment is on page 1066 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Smith, go ahead.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you. This is a simple amendment. It's meant to clarify the intent and eliminate unnecessary language only. The amendment just simply states that line 1 on page 2, excuse me, number one, there are two little parts to it here. On page 2, line 15, after "be" insert "developed by the Department of Social Services in consultation with the Department on Aging and shall then be"; and strike beginning with "after" in line 16 through "Aging" in line 17. And the second part is on page 3, line 23, strike the number (1). Then on page 4, strike lines 12 through 19 as unnecessary and redundant language. That's the content of the amendment and if there are any questions I'd try to answer them. If not, I would just simply ask your support of the amendment.
