

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the DeCamp amendment. Any further discussion? If not, the question is the adoption of the DeCamp amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. SENATOR DECAMP: We have got seven excused and we need, what, three votes? I suppose, let's see, how many are still excused? We need, what, two votes left, you say? Two little votes?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Seven.

SENATOR DECAMP: Two little votes. Come on Conway. Senator Abboud, excused; Senator Baack, excused; Senator Barrett. Just need one, just one, Jerry. Just one. What were you saying, Senator Nichol? Is Senator Lynch excused? Yes, yes, just one. Dear God, thank you for small favors.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Record, Mr. Clerk. Record vote has been asked for.

CLERK: Mr. President, record vote has been requested. (Read the record vote. See pages 1108-09 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 8 nays on adoption of the amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The amendment is adopted. Do you have anything else on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Pappas, I don't...you had an amendment, Senator, but I don't think you need it any longer. It was in with Senator DeCamp's...

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.
