

technical amendments and I emphasize the word "technical" because they truly are technical amendments that are described in this particular handout that we have distributed on a couple of occasions now. And the first deals with an infraction penalty problem brought to us by Senator Beyer. It clarifies concurrent jurisdiction between county and district courts, extends to infractions that carry fines of up to \$2500. The second is a clean-up proposal brought to us by Senators Conway and DeCamp intended to correct a bill we passed last year. And the third is a proposal brought to us by Senator Labedz repealing peace bonds. Again, those are technical. They are incorporated in amendment 2103. Amendment 2103 otherwise includes only matters that we have previously legislated upon in a rewritten form including a refinement of Senator Haberman's amendment presented on General File. With that, I would ask the adoption of amendment 2103.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any further discussion on the Hoagland amendment? If not, the question is the adoption of the Hoagland amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the adoption of the Hoagland amendment. Those of you that care to vote, I would appreciate your doing so so that we can move on. Thank you. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are 27 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Hoagland's amendment, AM2103.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Do you have anything further on it, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right.

CLERK: Senator Hoagland, I understand the amendment you had on 843 you want to withdraw, Senator. Is that right?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Yes, I would like to withdraw that amendment, Mr. Clerk.
