CLERK: (Commenced roll call vote.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: (Gavel.) Ladies and gentlemen, it is difficult to hear up here. News media, could we have your attention too. It is difficult to hear when several are talking, so if you would hold it down so the Clerk can hear your response. Thank you.

CLERK: (Continued roll call vote. See pages 1111-12 of the Legislative Journal.) 14 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion fails. The call is raised. Do you have something else on it, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Warner and Senator Hoagland. This amendment is AM 2138. It is also printed separately, Senator.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Did you state the page in the Journal?

CLERK: You will find it in your bill books, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay.

CLERK: It is amendment 2138.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hoagland, are you going to speak about this? Senator Warner.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: It is basically Senator Warner's amendment, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Oh.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: And I will speak to it after Senator Warner introduces it, sir.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Oh, all right. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, what this amendment does it in essence grew out in part of the problem we had on the deficit for additional probation officers and what the
