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eliminate, I hope...hopefully, the floor fight on several candidates running for the Exec Board, I am up front when I say I am doing this because I...if I receive 30 votes to suspend the rules, I will nominate Senator Cal Carsten to take over the Exec Board. And in January anyone that wants to run for the Exec Board, and there...I would say there isn't a senator on this floor that would not like to be a chairperson of the Exec Board including myself and many of my other friends, and it is going to be very difficult in January because it is going to have a lot of people running for that office. I can't say enough about Cal Carsten. Many of you that I have talked to have agreed with me that it would be a very touching, not only touching but a very good idea for us to show Cal Carsten, and I would have done this if Senator Warner was leaving the Legislature. I would have done it for Senator Nichol, but Senator Nichol is the Speaker. Because I think anyone that has ever served as many years and gained the respect of so many people on this floor, in the Rotunda, in the offices, the staff, everybody that has ever worked with Cal will know that he certainly deserves any honor that we can give him now. Just saying good-bye to him is not enough. I think that what I am doing here is asking for 30 votes, and then I will stand here and nominate Senator Cal Carsten as chairperson of the Exec Board, and I hope that there will be many of you that will agree with me. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Wesely, on suspension of the rules, then Senator Marsh.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I would like to refer directly to the rules. I have reviewed them since the issue came up last week and found that, in fact, Senator Marsh proposed a rule change which is now to be suspended, and that I was the Chairman of the Rules Committee and worked with Senator Marsh on the issue. We were attempting that time to clarify a situation. Senator Lamb was Chairman of the Executive Board and we had had some vacancies occur, if you remember, Senator Lamb. We had a chairman resign and then a vice-chairman resign, and we were confused on how exactly to follow the situation. And we were trying to look at that. And we were looking at the speaker situation, Exec Board, and we had a number of circumstances. However, this one particularly was not, obviously, in question because we...Senator Lamb was Exec Board Chairman and he hadn't resigned. So what we do with
