water quality. And I believe this bill is in good shape. I don't know of any particular institution or individual in this body that has deep reservations with the concept, and I would lend my wholehearted support to the passage of LB 310 because I think it is, as I said, using good foresight for the well drillers to participate in the legislative process and address the concerns the public may have.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you. Senator Schmit, would you like to close on the committee amendments, please.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I'll be very brief, Mr. President. I commend my colleagues who have supported the bill I think, and I also want to commend the industry. As Senator Rod Johnson has indicated, certainly those individuals who are most intimately involved with the profession, and they are drilling wells, ought to be involved in the kind of legislation which we have here today. I think it is a good piece of legislation. It has taken a lot of work. And I move for the adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The committee amendments are adopted. Senator Schmit, would you like to...

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the body, as I explained earlier, the committee amendments are the bill. I believe the bill has been adequately explained, and I would move for the advancement of the bill to Select File.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.
