Senator Labeledz, would you want some scoundrel from an extremist hate group assembling people and having charts by which they transmit this information? There is a difference between what I am talking about and demonstrating these techniques. To demonstrate it means to show how it is done. If you want to demonstrate the use of a firearm, then you have the firearm and you show how to disassemble it or assemble it, aim it, load it, fire it and whatever. But to merely write words on a chart, no pictures, is not illegal. And the group could have every member wearing a swastika on his or her arm and they could declare their hatred. And if it is in writing, there is nothing wrong with it. I think this amendment, for the purpose of clarification...

SPEAKER NICHOL: One minute.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hoagland, please.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: As one of the co-sponsors of LB 772, along with Senator Beutler and Senator Chizek, who is temporarily off the floor visiting with a group from his district, I would beseech you to vote against this amendment. If you are a supporter of LB 772, if you are committed to the concept of legislating in this area, do not support this amendment. Senator Chambers, in his characteristically intelligent and craftsmanlike way, is making a point with this amendment. He is trying to make a constitutional point with this amendment. And it is my sense that if we adopt this amendment and add a third prohibition to the bill in addition to the two that are already set out in Section 2, the bill will very likely be found by the Attorney General to be constitutionally suspect because let me tell you what Senator Chambers' amendment
