Mr. President, Senator DeCamp has amendments to 881 to be printed. (See page 1198 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, I do have one other item to be read in. Senator Lynch has amendments to 895. (See pages 1198-99 of the Legislative Journal.)

I have a request from Senator Harris to unbracket LB 452.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Harris has a motion to unbracket LB 452. Any objections? If not, so ordered. Yes, we might as well go back to LB 772 till noon. Mr. Clerk, what do you have next?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment...Senator Chambers. Mr. President, I understand Senator Chambers wishes to withdraw his two amendments remaining. He wishes to withdraw.

SPEAKER NICHOL: They are withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment by Senator DeCamp. Mr. President, the next amendment I have that can be considered is an amendment by Senators Vard Johnson, DeCamp, Hoagland and Chizek. It is found on page 1160 of the Journal.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hoagland, are you going to handle that?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Yes, let me make the introductory comment about this amendment and then any of the other co-sponsors of the amendment can certainly speak to it if they would like. This is an amendment that was prompted by Senator DeCamp and Senator Vard Johnson's concerns. Senator DeCamp first printed his amendment and then we had a meeting, Senator DeCamp and Senator Chizek and Vard Johnson and others of us, and added to Senator DeCamp's earlier amendment to result in the amendment on page 1160 of the Journal, which you can see. And, basically, what the amendment does is it strikes the word "technique" wherever it appears. It appears twice on page 3 and by taking out the word "technique" it limits the application of the bill to situations where the training or the instruction is done
