Number one, they do identical to what the amendment that Ernie offered and we adopted a few minutes ago without discussion, debate or explanation because we went baaaa and everybody followed, or as Ernie claims. The second thing they do, they strike the words "or techniques" so that everybody knows when you are talking about paramilitary you are talking about the following things, incendiary devices, explosives, firearms. If you say, "or techniques", I think it just opens it up to a Pandora's box, as they say, of absolutely anything. Is it "or techniques" when somebody tells somebody that you can practice civil disobedience by laying down in the street and being limp and having the police carry away your body? I question the propriety of the bill. I accept the fact that it is going to pass. I want to improve it as much as possible. The amendments gets that a long ways away along that course. I would urge you to adopt the amendment. It does significantly and dramatically change the bill and limits it but that limitation is good and there are some that would say it might even be constitutional with the amendment. I don't know, I still think it has got problems but put the amendment on and I certainly won't bother it anymore and I just heard Senator Chambers say he wouldn't and maybe get this over with. I would urge adoption of the amendment.
