SENATOR CHAMBERS: I don't disagree.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Okay, no more questions. I just...I support Senator Chambers' motion to override the Chair and I hope other people will think about the different times that we've amended bills that are not even halfway close and this one is so close, so along the same line, the same subject matter as everything else that I hope they vote to override the Chair.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Thank you, Senator Pappas. Senator Hefner, did you wish to speak on the overrule motion?

SENATOR HEFNER: I call the question, Mr. President.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? Do I see five hands? I do. The motion is that the debate be ceased. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. The motion is to cease debate. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Debate has ceased. Senator Chambers, to close on your overruling Chair motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I don't think I can add anything to what has already been said. I'm simply asking that we vote to overrule the Chair.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Mr. Chairman.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Senator Higgins, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR HIGGINS: I'd just like a point of clarification.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: State your point.

SENATOR HIGGINS: If we vote to overrule the Chair, then Senator Chambers would be able to present this amendment that he is talking about, football betting. Is that...?
