

amendments. It is to change the word "lives" to "residents". I would offer this little technical amendment to the bigger amendment, and then I'll discuss the bigger amendment. (Second V. Johnson amendment appears on page 1219 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: We're voting on the adoption of the amendment to the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Excuse me. Senator Higgins, you wish to talk?

SENATOR HIGGINS: Right. Senator Vard Johnson, what page in the bill is this on, and what line? Where does it appear in the bill? I beg your pardon?

SPEAKER NICHOL: I'm sorry, I missed out. Senator Higgins, were you going to ask a question?

SENATOR HIGGINS: I'm trying to figure this out.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay.

SENATOR HIGGINS: We're striking the word "residents" and changing it to "lives".

SPEAKER NICHOL: I believe it is the other way around.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Is that correct, or is it the reverse? So we are striking "residents" and putting in "lives", then this would pertain to people whether they were a Nebraska resident or not. Senator Johnson, could you explain to me the Rule of 500?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: No. No, I cannot explain the Rule of 500. There are certain occasions when...

SENATOR HIGGINS: If your aide come down there...

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: And explained it to me, then maybe I could explain it.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Okay.
