

will fund, we will replace at least \$7.5 million of the Cash Reserve Fund.

SENATOR WARNER: If we did that in connection with the other bill, it will not make a significant difference in the total amount available. It could be a little. But the important thing is we won't have the General Fund operating with one-time money to that amount for '87.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I do understand what you are saying, yes.

SENATOR WARNER: So at some point we would need to amend either this, or...

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: You will need to amend the other bill. This bill...

SENATOR WARNER: The other bill, we can handle that. Yes, I know about...the other bill we have no problem with. It is this one I want to be sure...

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Yes, this one, this one is clean.

SPEAKER NICHOL: One minute.

SENATOR WARNER: But we would need to amend here to make sure it went to the cash reserve fund as opposed to...

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: If it was our collective choice for this money to, for this particular amount of money to go to the Cash Reserve Fund, we could either amend this bill, or in the alternative use the other restoration bill to amend this bill after it passes and becomes law.

SENATOR WARNER: That is no problem either.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Higgins, please.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Johnson, I didn't mean to embarrass you with that law of 500, like I said, I've been 20 years in the insurance business and I'd never heard of it myself.
