SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, I would move for the advancement of the bill. This bill...these next four bills, as I understand, are basically in a class of revisor bills. This bill does a couple of things. It repeals obsolete statutes concerning surplus copies of the statutes that are held by the Secretary of State that was established in 1945. The bill would also move Section 49-510 regarding the sale of superseded versions of the statutes to Article VII, Chapter 49. The overall effect of the bill would be to unify provisions regarding the sale of the statutes of Nebraska, and eliminate the unnecessary sections. I believe that is all that the bill does contain, and would again move for the advancement.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Please vote. Ladies and gentlemen, those that are here, we have plenty here. If you would help me out I'd appreciate it, if you care to vote. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance 991, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 993.

CLERK: LB 993 by Senator Beutler. (Read title.) Introduced in January of this year, referred to the Executive Board, advanced to General File. I have no amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Cal Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I would again move for the advancement of the bill. This bill would repeal several statutes relating to the organization of the Legislature, the structure and activities of the Legislative Council, and the duties of the Executive Board. The statutes, which are hereby repealed, have been identified as...have been identified as unnecessary and as being obsolete, so are not really necessary or essential to the conduct of the legislative function, and are just literally unused. Thank you. I would again move for the advancement.
