

action this country has ever had. So with that reservation, I will not vote for the advancement of the bill today, but once talking to the Veterans Affairs and find out what is behind it, then perhaps it might be something that would be advisable. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Hoagland. There are no lights on, Senator Hoagland. Senator Goll, would you like to close.

SENATOR GOLL: Very briefly, Mr. Speaker, this bill merely removes from the statutes the loan authorization. The loans that have been made are steadily decreasing. It has been since 1975, I believe, the Vietnam war ended in seventy-two or three or four, and so the Appropriations Committee is merely removing this authorization from the statutes and that is all I have to say, Mr. Speaker. Call for the vote.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Okay, all those in favor of advancing LB 1100 vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Senator Goll.

SENATOR GOLL: Mr. Chairman, I need seven votes. If everybody will vote, why we won't have to go through this process. I need six votes. Let's go and I will call, and a call of the house with call in votes please.

SENATOR CARSTEN: A call of the house has been requested. All those in favor of going under call will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The house is under call. Will all those senators within the sound of my voice, please return to the Chamber and register your presence, please.
