

schedules in the statutes which comply with the federal schedules. This bill revises the Nebraska Uniform Controlled Substances Act in order to amend our state schedules to conform with the federal law. Congress amended the federal schedules last year and, therefore, these changes are necessary. I would ask your acceptance and approval of this legislation and advancement.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Landis, please. Senator Landis. Senator Landis passes. Do you have any further closing, Senator Lynch?

SENATOR LYNCH: The question he may have asked is why do we need to change the statutes and it is simply that it will provide our own court system in Nebraska the opportunity to prosecute where necessary and where justified. With that, I would close, Mr. Chairman.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The question is, shall the bill be advanced? All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted that care to? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance 1160, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The bill is advanced. Next bill, LB 1056.

CLERK: 1056 by Senator Carson Rogers. (Read title.) Introduced on January 16, referred to the Government Committee for a public hearing, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Rogers.

SENATOR ROGERS: I would just move for its advancement. It is such a simple bill.

SENATOR CARSTEN: That is your opening and closing?

SENATOR ROGERS: Yes. In better be, I just got here, Mr. Speaker.
