LB 1056, 1114A

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you, Mr. President. In line with the Accountability and Disclosure Commission, I will not vote on this bill but it will not in any way affect me. I don't want to take a chance since by brother-in-law is an elected county official. Thank you.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Thank you, Senator Higgins. Anything further, Senator Rogers?

SENATOR ROGERS: This bill simply states one specific date when salaries can be set for county officials. The way the statutes were, there was two different dates because an incumbent had to file one date and a person that was not an incumbent had to file another date, and county boards, some of them were getting mixed up on when they had to set the salaries. So this simply sets one date regardless of whether you are an incumbent or nonincumbent as far as setting salaries.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Okay, thank you, Senator Rogers. This then is the closing. The question is now, shall the bill advance? Those in favor vote aye, those opposed to vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the advancement of the bill.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The bill does advance even without Senator Rogers' vote. We have added another bill to the list. The Speaker has 1114A. There was a request that this bill be expedited this morning. Mr. Clerk, do you need to make any further announcements for that?

CLERK: Mr. President, the only item is that I have no E & R amendments on the bill, Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I would move that 1114A be advanced to E & R for Engrossing.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The question is, shall LB 1114 be advanced? All those in favor vote aye...say aye. Those opposed no. The bill is advanced. Now we move into the next section of bills that is on the agenda, is that correct, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir.
