

sometimes where there is a joint city-county housing authority by both the city council and county boards. There is no eligibility requiring who should serve on the board except that they in fact live in the district, and because of that, there is always a concern that some of the people appointed to the almost 150 housing boards may exactly know what their responsibility is and it is an enormous responsibility since, in fact, they spend millions and millions of dollars, more in some cases in most counties and most cities. So as a result of that, the effort was developed to develop through the Department of Economic Development a manual which could be offered to the people who serve on these boards to help them better understand their responsibilities and be less likely to be nominated by bureaucrats and others in how public money is spent and do a better job in their capacity. The amendment by the committee simply changes on line 6 the words "Department of Economic Development" to "Nebraska Resources" which is the appropriate and proper designation of the Cash Fund out of which would come the cost for the development and printing of the manuals. It is an amendment to the committee amendment, I am sorry. So, Mr. Chairman, I would move first of all the amendment to the committee amendment which I have just described.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The question is...oh, excuse me, Senator Pirsch. Amendment to the committee amendment.

SENATOR PIRSCH: As I understand, this is the committee amendment. Is there another amendment?

SENATOR CARSTEN: (Mike off) committee, Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Yes, Mr. President, the committee amendment actually allows for the cost to be developed and charged back so that funds can be used by the Department of Economic Development for their cost. The amendment to the committee amendment simply changes the description of the Cash Fund through which the money would flow for that purpose from the Department of Economic Development Cash Fund to Nebraska Resources Cash Fund.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Oh, I see. So this is another amendment then besides the one we had before.

SENATOR LYNCH: Yes, ma'am.
