LB 968, 1016

I really want to again commend Senator Johnson and the supporters of this bill. I would ask that it be advanced.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The question is, shall LB 1016 as amended be advanced? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The bill as amended is advanced. The next bill is LB 968, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 968 is a bill that was introduced by Senator Rogers. (Read title.) It was read on January 13, referred to Banking Committee, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments. Senator Rogers has an amendment to the committee amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR ROGERS: It was passed out a little bit ago, Mr. Speaker and members, to you. These amendments to the committee amendments are simply what some of the associations wanted to put on. These are concerning thrashers and petroleum and fertilizer and feed and seed, that they still want to be protected after this bill is enacted. If anybody wants to ask a question about it, I will try to explain it. Otherwise, I move to adopt these amendments to the committee amendments.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Vickers, please. Senator Chronister.

SENATOR CHRONISTER: Mr. President and colleagues, I rise to support the amendment as well as the bill. During the hearing process there were six proponents on the bill. There were no opponents and the amendment that Senator Rogers is presenting has the blessing, I understand, of all those parties concerned with this amendment and bill. I urge the adoption of the amendment and the advancing of the bill. Thank you.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Any closing on your amendment, Senator Rogers?

SENATOR ROGERS: No, there is...just to ask for the advancement of the amendment to the committee amendments.
