Yes, you can look at your committee statement and you will notice that there has been nobody on the opponent side but also when Senator Chronister mentioned the fact that it has all been worked out, everybody agrees to it, who you will notice has agreed to it are the suppliers of agricultural products and the suppliers of agricultural credit. Do you see anything in your bill book about this bill being either supported or opposed by any agricultural group, any farmer or any rancher? We are being treated like a bunch of puppets out there already. The simple fact of the matter is there is absolutely no credit at all available in rural Nebraska today.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Ten seconds.

SENATOR VICKERS: None. So we are going to put in one more little thing to make the banks, who are already nervous as can be, a little bit more nervous. Now, if you want to do something that is going to cause a lot of repercussions this summer, this spring, then pass this kind of legislation. The fact of the matter is we are honest people. We will pay our bills if we have any money. If we don't have any money, we can't pay our bills. It is that simple. Now, do you really think that you are doing your farmer and rancher friends a favor when you put in one more little means that makes it difficult for them to get their seeds or fertilizer? I don't think we are.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Time is up on the bill. We are going to have to move off of it. I am sorry about that but that is the rules that we have to go by. We will move to the next bill, LB 763. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 763 was a bill introduced by Senator Miller. (Read title.) Introduced on January 8, referred to Health and Human Services, advanced to General File. There are Health and Human Services committee amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Wesely, on the committee amendments.
