

have to stick it in the front of their drivers' license or local political subdivisions requiring them to stick it on their ID badges, so we took Senator Chambers' bill and we wrote a little amendment and it says, fine, let's repeal this section, no sweat, except when you apply for your driver's license, you still have to submit your Social Security number. It will be blind to all the world except for the Department of Motor Vehicles and it will be used to verify the status of a person's driving record when they come to us from another state. There are annually 2,000 people who attempt to come to Nebraska and get their drivers licenses and, in fact, have difficulty with drivers licenses in other states and are not entitled to them. So we wanted to keep that facet in place and yet at the same time respond to the legitimate concerns of Senator Chambers. That is the amendment. I move its adoption.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The motion is to adopt the committee amendments. All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the committee amendments.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The committee amendments are adopted. Senator Chambers, on the bill as amended.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, to try to improve on what Senator Landis did on that bill would be like trying to guild a lily so I am simply going to say I accept everything he said because it is totally true. The bill may seem like a peewee but it has a profiled significance and I am asking that you vote to advance it.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The question is, shall LB 878 as amended be advanced? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The bill as amended is advanced. The next bill, LB 1184. Mr. Clerk. Senator DeCamp, are you going to take it?
