LB 889, 1184

SENATOR HIGGINS: Senator Vickers, wasn't that something that you just brought up? You thought we were reducing it to 30 days notice?

SENATOR VICKERS: The committee amendments remove automobile insurance from the provisions of this bill, Senator Higgins. What I am telling you is that the statutes that govern automobile insurance only require 30 days notice. So I intend to attempt to change that on Select File.

SENATOR HIGGINS: I will help you. Thank you.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Anything further on the committee amendments? If not, all those in favor of the committee amendments to the bill will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted that care to? Vote pretty quick. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the committee amendments.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The committee amendments have been adopted. Now back on the bill as amended. Senator DeCamp. The motion is to advance LB 1184 as amended. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The bill is advanced as amended. The next bill, 889.

CLERK: Mr. President, 889 is a bill introduced by Senator Lynch. (Read title.) Introduced on January 9, referred to Revenue, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Hefner, are you going to take the committee amendments?

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President and members of the body, yes, I will handle the Revenue Committee amendments. This bill is LB 889. It was introduced by Senator Lynch. The bill changes the requirements regarding the revenue and expenditures that local government file with the State Auditor. This amendment would cut down the number of
