the Business and Labor Committee, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Barrett, do you have the committee amendments?

SENATOR BARRETT: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members. This 1203 is the Boiler Inspection Act. The committee amendments reinstate the current minimum ten years of experience requirement for the position of a boiler inspector, and finally, clarify that boilers in places of public assembly shall, in fact, be subject to boiler inspection. I would ask the body to adopt the amendments.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The call is raised. The motion is to adopt the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of committee amendments.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The committee amendments are adopted. Senator Barrett, on the bill as amended.

SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you, Mr. President and members. The bill as amended would update some various provisions of our Boiler Inspection Act. Specifically we're going to eliminate some requirements for the position of boiler inspector. We're going to designate some places where some small boilers shall be exempt from inspections, and with any luck at all, we're going to authorize that the Commissioner of Labor adopt certain national inspection codes as rules and regulations and various and assorted other items including that no fee shall be charged for the inspections of boilers in state owned buildings. I would heartily recommend the bill to the body and would hope that the body would advance the bill to E & R Initial. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The motion is the advancement of LB 1203 as amended. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The bill as amended is advanced. Next
