SPEAKER NICHOL: We will move on to LB 464.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator, the first item I have on 464 are E & R amendments.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I would move the E & R amendments be adopted.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You have heard the motion. All those in favor vote (sic) aye. Opposed nay. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have amendments from Senator Hoagland to the bill. Those are on page 1123 of the Journal.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Rod Johnson. Senator Hoagland, excuse me.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Ladies and gentlemen, on page 1123 of the Journal, we have had printed as amendments to this bill the terroristic threats criminal prohibition. You know, the Nebraska Supreme Court, about a year and a half ago, found unconstitutional the current terroristic threats law. The Judiciary Committee has considered a bill this year which we reported out unanimously. It is quite far down the list. This is another bill that amends the criminal laws. I would suggest that we adopt this amendment which will continue the prohibition against terroristic threats. It is a gap in our criminal statutes that we need to fill and I offer this amendment to do that.
