CLERK: Excuse me, Senator, I do have an amendment. Mr. President, there are amendments pending by the Public Health Committee, as I understand, Health and Human Services, excuse me.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Mr. President and members, the Public Health Committee, which is now the Health and Human Services Committee, did consider LB 804. The one concern we had in the committee and the hearing was the question of who should make up this Task Force to look at the Alzheimer's Disease problem and come up with some solutions to it. It is now a seven-member committee. Two members are selected at large to serve on the committee. I would like to, for intent purposes on the floor, explain what we are trying to do with this committee amendment. There are now those two spots from the general public. We, on this committee amendment, raised that to four. That would go from seven to nine members on this Task Force then.
