

varied membership on that committee. I assure you that those in the support groups all over the state are going to be able to make some recommendations to the Governor for that membership. And so I would support the committee amendment as stated by Senator Wesely.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Senator Carsten. That is the only light. Senator Wesely, to close on the amendment.

SENATOR WESELY: Again, this just goes from two to four public members and they can be selected from a number of backgrounds and would support the committee amendments.

SENATOR LANDIS: The question is as to whether or not the amendment shall be adopted. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Wesely's amendment.

SENATOR LANDIS: The amendment is adopted. Senator Hall, on the bill.

CLERK: Mr. President, I do have one additional amendment. Excuse me, Senator. Senator Wesely would move to amend by adding the emergency clause. (The Wesely amendment appears on page 1288 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, as I mentioned in my discussion, in order for them to come back perhaps next year with legislation, this Task Force would exist 12 months to 18 months. Nevertheless, they may be able to come back with some legislation next year and we wouldn't want to have to wait two more legislative sessions to act on the Alzheimer's problem. If we add the E clause, they might be able to meet sooner, at least, three months sooner and that would help us, I think, get started on the problem. So I would suggest we add the E clause.

SENATOR LANDIS: There being no other lights on, Senator Wesely, do you wish to close? That will waive closing. The question is the adoption of the E clause. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. The Clerk will record.
