

continuation of LB 14 of special session dealing with the limits of liability against subdivisions. If you recall, back last October we had a bill in special session that limited the amounts of liability to political subdivisions to \$5 million per occurrence and \$1 million per individual claim and this will, this amendment will bring the same limitations against the employee that works for the political subdivision, bringing those same limitations in line with the employee of \$5 million and \$1 million. I know there is going to be quite a bit of discussion on this bill and so I think I will leave it at that for the purposes of introduction and have at it.

SENATOR LAMB PRESIDING

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Hoagland had an amendment printed last year, Mr. President, on page 2141, and you want to withdraw that. Senator Hoagland would like to withdraw, Mr. President.

SENATOR LAMB: The amendment is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is that offered by Senator Hannibal. Senator Hannibal's amendment is on page 1057 of the Journal.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Hannibal.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Mr. Clerk, is that amendment request 1704?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Okay. Mr. Chairman and members, this is the amendment that I was talking about. It strikes the original bill and inserts this amendment, however, the bill is the same with one exception and that is that it brings the limits of liability down to, instead of having no limits right now, down to \$5 million and \$1 million and I offer that amendment.
