

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: With all bills you come up at the last minute and you have to make some changes. I've passed these out. I'll go through them quickly. The first one says strike "a time specified by the board", and insert after the words...insert the words "the mutually agreed upon date". In other words, it just means that they are mutually going to agree upon the date. The second one says "on the mutually agreed upon date". This amendment merely clarifies the intent of the section. The third one, it says, strike "may in addition", and insert after "Nebraska", "and shall also". Now this amendment clarifies that the intent that the provisions shall be undertaken for the testing of tractors due to the international standards. Then the next one is strike "board" and insert "the University of Nebraska, or by any OECD test taken". This amendment provides that if a tractor has been tested here or abroad at any OECD station the results shall be forwarded to the Department of Agriculture. Then we have one that says after "manufacturer's" insert "representations as to". This is a technical amendment referring to the claims of the manufacturers. The last one is the university, with the concurrence of the manufacturer, has asked this bill be passed as quickly as possible in order that they may begin to get approval as an OECD testing site. So I'd like to add the emergency clause to the bill. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Rod Johnson on the Haberman amendment.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President, once again I would reiterate my earlier feelings. This is a friendly amendment to the committee amendments. And I would urge the body's adoption of Senator Haberman's amendment to the amendment.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Any closing, Senator Haberman? The question is, shall the Haberman amendment to the committee amendments be adopted? All those in favor, simple majority required. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Haberman's amendment.
