SENATOR WESELY: Yes, that is what I've got.

SENATOR HIGGINS: This isn't one where you change it so much that you just put a new copy in here?

SENATOR WESELY: No, no, if you look, Marge, it's still the same as all other bills. The underlined areas is the new language. Just because it's got white papers doesn't mean it is new language.

SENATOR HIGGINS: That's what I was trying to figure out, if you had gutted something and...

SENATOR WESELY: Oh, no. No.

SENATOR HIGGINS: It's just the underlined parts that are new then.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, yes.
