SPEAKER NICHOL: That could be arranged.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay, so with the understanding that that could be done and that that may be a more effective way to get it solved than what we're doing, and, as I say, that means in effect, as I understand it, if it went to committee and the committee came up with something and they did a little lobbying work and got their votes lined up, then they would have the ability to get it decided up here. The Speaker is indicating you wouldn't have to worry about the priority thing and all that...I guess I'm of a mind to believe that that might be the better way right now to get the thing resolved. You might get it that way. From my way of looking around and counting, I don't see the numbers being ready to be approved right now, but I don't know. So, I'm not intending to kill it at all. Let me ask you this, let me ask the Clerk a question. If I asked to unanimously bracket it for a week, would that take precedence over the motion I got? What do you want to do, Bill?

SPEAKER NICHOL: I think there is a bracket motion coming, if you want to withdraw yours.

SENATOR DECAMP: Would that be what you'd kind of like to do?

SPEAKER NICHOL: I would say so, if it's in a realm of reasonable, like a week or something like that.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay, why don't we do this. Why don't I pull mine, if nobody is terribly bent out of shape over it, bracket it for a week or something, see if you can work out something. I know it's a politically sensitive thing. If there were any way at all, I'd like to not vote on it, election year and all that you know, but if you can work out something, get it worked out and get your votes lined up it seems to be because I'm not sure anybody is being helped on any side or in any way the way we're going at this, so, I'll ask unanimous consent to withdraw whatever I offered and...
