

refresh your memory on this bill. This bill deals with those folk who are issued traffic tickets for motor vehicle violations and who fail to appear in court at the right time and after notice by the Department of Motor Vehicles of their failure to report in court at the right time, the Department of Motor Vehicles can revoke their drivers licenses. There hasn't been a whole lot of argument about the impropriety of this bill or the lack of good public policy in this bill, but Senator Vickers offers an amendment to set a specific time line, I think it's 20 days for the Department of Motor Vehicles to give notice, actual notice to the person that he or she has got to make her peace, his or her peace with a local court system, otherwise the license is going to be revoked. And I looked over that amendment with Senator Vickers, oh, about a month ago when he first wrote it. It seemed okay to me, so I would offer his amendment at this juncture.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on the amendments? If not, the motion is to adopt the amendment offered by Senator Vickers and Johnson. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Again, as you can tell from the page number, my colleagues, this is an older amendment, but this was one given to me by the Department of Motor Vehicles. The Department of Motor Vehicles has asked that this particular law only begin to apply to traffic citations
